Principal's Message

It was exciting to see returning and new students start a fresh new year! We have been busy establishing routines especially with the new Safe Schools Strategy now in place. September is the time that schools practice various safety drills and some will be sporadically practiced throughout the school year. Drills like Lockdown and Hold and Secure sometimes heighten students' awareness of community safety. We spend time assuring students that these practices are in place for so many reasons such as construction, an animal on grounds or to support a schoolmate in need. Drills help us know what to do to maintain safety for everyone.

Safe Schools

Last year the NS government introduced the Safe School Strategy to build consistency in schools across the province. There are many layers to the safe schools strategy such as Emergency Protocols, the new School Code of Conduct, as well as a School Matrix and Classroom Routines that promote positive, proactive strategies to build expected behaviors in the learning space. You can find the matrix on the last page of the Parent/Guardian Handbook. Each month we will highlight a section of our Strategy:


Breakfast Program

School Advisory Committee (SAC)

Our SAC also meets the **first Wednesday of each month at Gpm** in the staff room. The Caudle Park School Advisory Council are responsible for:

- providing a voice in decision-making.
- working in collaboration with the principal and participating in efforts to improve student achievement and student and community well-being by receiving information on the school improvement plan and monitoring progress and improvements under the plan, assisting in developing policies that promote student achievement and safe and inclusive schools, and developing strategies to improve and support the extracurricular programs and special projects of the school
- maintaining effective communication with parents/guardians by holding regular public meetings and making copies of agendas/ minutes available upon request.
- advising the principal and staff on any matters that are referred to the school advisory council by the principal, the Regional Center or the Minister in accordance with the terms of the school advisory council agreement, determining priorities for spending the funds allocated to support the mandate of the school advisory council,
- advising the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development or the Provincial Advisory Council on policy and other educational matters.
