#### Student Success Plan

Our student success plan inspires and guides teaching practices within the school. It is a partnership between home and school to build successful learners. The First Cycle goals are based on school assessment information and builds on the focus of academic success from last year.

#### Safe Schools Strategy


A matrix moment is reviewed daily in classrooms and in the office about how interactions sound like in all locations of the school. This aligns nicely with the Monthly theme of Respect. Many students use joking as a means of communication. They often don't understand that jokes at another's expense are hurtful and harmful to the receiver. It impacts on others' hearts and brains and if they hear negativity on a regular basis, it can impact on self awareness. Caudle, we are committed to building each other up within the learning environment.

Nova Scotia Mi'kmaq elders traditionally use story telling to educate their community. Here is a lesson from the <u>Water Hole</u> on conservation, depleting resources and responsibility. As a school community, we would like to build awareness around drinking water and water bottles. Frequent reminders for packing water bottles happens with almost every communication home. Our fountains were purchased to reduce water waste and to build student independence. In the last 2 years, we have given out 250 donated water bottles that mainly end up in the lost and found after use. When water bottles are forgotten, we



make attempts to call home, then interrupt learning for students to collect them. The school has taken funds from the breakfast program to purchase disposable cups for students. Teachers have used their own funds to purchase cups as well. School funds are designated for specific purposes to fulfill educational needs. We ask for consideration to the interruptions of learning time and how families can establish consistent routines around packing water bottles every day.

#### PTA / SAC

The parent committees are off to an amazing start! Thank you to all families who have supported the Halloween Dance and DFS Fundraiser. We have raised over \$2000 towards next year's school supplies. This is a huge relief to families at the start of each school year. Our next big event is the Holiday store - aka "Caudle Co-op". It's on December 18th. It relies on household donations (toys, books, knick-knacks, etc.). Students 'shop' for presents for family members. More information will be coming out soon! You can send donations in at any time. Our SAC has been looking at resources within the school as well as our Student Success Plan./Goals. The SSP is reviewed in 3 cycles annually with this committee.
