For the past few weeks, the students have been working hard moving through the stages of business development such as coming up with an idea/product, branding and marketing their business and producing their products to sell.

On this day, classroom teachers will be signing up for a timeslot to bring their class to the market to view and purchase items. Most items will fall in the \$1-\$3 range.
