The vaccination is free for anyone with a current NS health card, and the health nurse is able to vaccinate anyone 2 years of age and older who has a NS health card. Feel free to stop by for this vaccination.

Caring Schools


PTA / SAC

Learning about Learning!



Last month, we looked at our literacy goal of helping students reach reading benchmarks. This month we will look at the Math goal which is improving achievement in computational fluency.

Computational fluency is the ability to use strategies to

figure out math facts quickly and efficiently. A student who has computational fluency would be able to use strategies together with the facts he or she knows to figure out a more challenging problem. Through game play, students can build number sense that is quick and accurate. It encourages flexible thinking as opposed to limited computation like memorization of facts.

Remembrance Day Assembly


