Principal's Message

It's hard to believe that we are a month into school! We are settling into new (and old) routines. Our teachers have spent most of the month working on routines, building relationships with their students and getting to know where they are in their learning.

We continue to have parents turning their cars at the driveway during bus pick up and delivery. Cars are not allowed to park in front of the driveway or enter school grounds from 8am - 2:50pm. Please watch out for the students, they are often not watching for cars.

With Thanksgiving just around the corner we realize that we have a lot to be thankful for here at Caudle Park. At our school, our students are participating in fun and engaging learning opportunities each and every day.

Caring Schools

We follow the **Caring Schools Curriculum** and have monthly themes that promote positive relations as well as self regulation and esteem. In October, our theme is



Gratitude. Gratitude is the quality of being thankful; readiness to show appreciation for, and to return, kindness. The students at Caudle Park demonstrate gratitude each day in the acts that they do and positive outlook that they share. We selected October for this theme as it fits well with Thanksgiving next weekend. Teachers use circle discussions to share each monthly living value. School Success Plan

Our **Student Success Plan** keeps us focussed on student achievement each and every day. Each school in HRCE sets 3 goals: **Literacy, Math and Wellbeing.** Teachers along with support from our Teaching Support Team (resource, speech, psy, etc) are

already assessing students in the classroom to see where their strengths and needs are in each area. The school SAC also supports our success goals providing feedback and any resources necessary to help us reach our goals with success. Our resource model will be working in 8 week blocks this year with short cycle assessment and intervention. Many of our specialists offer Tier 1 support; working with the teacher and students directly in the classroom. We already have a math coach in the school supporting the computational fluency (knowing our numbers with flexibility and efficiently) goal and we are also anticipating a pilot math support directed to the grade 3 level. We are off to a great start!!



- providing a voice in decision-making.
- working in collaboration with the principal and participating in efforts to improve student achievement and student and community well-being by receiving information on the school improvement plan and monitoring progress and improvements under the plan, assisting in developing policies that promote student achievement and safe and inclusive schools, and developing strategies to improve and support the extracurricular programs and special projects of the school
- maintaining effective communication with parents/guardians by holding regular public meetings and making copies of agendas/ minutes available upon request.
- advising the principal and staff on any matters that are referred to the school advisory council by the principal, the Regional Center or the Minister in accordance with the terms of the school advisory council agreement, determining priorities for spending the funds allocated to support the mandate of the school advisory council,
- advising the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development or the Provincial Advisory Council on policy and other educational matters. Preparing an annual report in the form and containing the information determined by the Minister.
