#### ATTENDANCE: DID YOU KNOW?

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school-and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and secondary courses.

· Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.

- · Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- · Students can still fall behind if they miss just 1 or 2 days every few weeks.
- · Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- · Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

## STUDENT SUCCESS PLANNING

Teachers have been working diligently on developing strength in computational fluency in math, following visual schedules and improving small group instruction in literacy. Small group instruction allows teachers to work with 2-4 students strategically to reinforce and practice skills that students have not yet mastered. Our wellbeing goal continues to look at how positive wellbeing impacts on learning. Teachers have been looking at culturally responsive practices to support students with their self identity and nurture confidence so they can celebrate and be themselves wherever they go!
