equity of others and of themselves creates a sense of justice, when you have a sense of justice you create a better and kinder world.


PRIMARY ORIENTATION

TICKS

The wooded areas are open for play. Students are asked to keep sticks in the woods and use sticks only for building. There are several kinds of ticks in Nova Scotia, but only the blacklegged tick carries the bacteria and virus that cause tick borne diseases, such as Lyme disease.
